"TRANSFORMING ANATOMY LEARNING: ENGAGING FIRST YEAR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS WITH 3D MODELS, VISUAL CHARTS, AND PEER-DRIVEN SEMINARS"

OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE:

This practice aims to help first-year students understand anatomy in a more practical and enjoyable way. Through interactive tools and support from senior students, our objectives are:

- To make it easier for students to learn complex anatomy by using 3D models and visual charts.
- To create a friendly learning environment where third-year students guide first-year students through seminars.
- To make anatomy classes more interesting and hands-on, which will help students learn better and feel more confident in their studies.

BACKGROUND:

Learning human anatomy is essential for dental students, but it can be quite difficult to grasp through lectures alone. Recognizing this, Mansarovar Dental College decided to adopt a new teaching style to make anatomy more engaging. The goal is to connect theoretical knowledge with practical learning by using 3D models, visual aids, and peer-driven seminars.

THE PRACTICE:

Implemented for the 2023-24 first-year batch, this approach has three main parts:

- 1. **3D Models**: First-year students use 3D models to gain a hands-on understanding of anatomy, making it easier to visualize structures.
- 2. **Visual Charts**: Detailed charts support learning by helping students visually connect concepts they read about.
- 3. **Peer-Driven Seminars**: Third-year students take charge of interactive seminars, guiding first-year students through topics and answering questions. This not only benefits first-year students but also strengthens the knowledge of the seniors.



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EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:

The practice has shown positive outcomes since it began:

- **Better Test Scores**: Anatomy test results improved by about 20% compared to previous years, showing better understanding.
- **Higher Engagement**: About 85% of students reported feeling more interested in anatomy and confident in their studies.
- **Stronger Peer Connections**: Both first- and third-year students enjoyed working together, which has created a stronger learning community at the college.



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CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS:

- 1. **Challenge**: Third-year students were initially nervous about leading seminars.
 - Solution: We organized training sessions to build their confidence and provide tips on effective teaching.
- 2. **Challenge**: There were limited high-quality 3D models available due to budget.
 - Solution: We set up a schedule so that all students could use the models in turns, and we secured additional models through funding support.

RESOURCES REQUIRED:

- A variety of detailed 3D anatomy models.
- High-quality visual charts.
- Seminar spaces with audio-visual tools for interactive sessions.
- Training workshops to prepare third-year students for their role as mentors.

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CONCLUSION:

This approach has changed the way anatomy is taught at Mansarovar Dental College by making it more interactive and student friendly. Through peer-driven learning and practical tools, students feel more engaged and confident, setting a new standard for student-centered learning in dental education.

COMPREHENSIVE DENTAL PRACTICE TRAINING FOR INTERNS

OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE:

Mansarovar Dental College, Bhopal, introduced the Comprehensive Dental Practice Training program for interns with two main goals:

- 2. To help interns understand their limitations during clinical practice and train them to know when to refer patients to specialists for further treatment.

BACKGROUND:

This includes decision-making, patient management, and recognizing when to refer complex cases to specialists. The college aims to prepare interns for the real-world challenges they will face in private practice and other dental settings after graduation.

THE PRACTICE:

- Simulated Private Clinic Environment: Interns are given cases in a setting that mirrors the conditions of a private clinic. They manage patient care under supervision, which gives them a taste of real-world dental practice.
- Comprehensive Case Management: Interns treat a wide range of cases, from simple procedures like fillings and cleanings to more complex treatments such as root canals and orthodontics. This exposure allows them to handle diverse dental conditions confidently.
- Specialist Referrals: The program trains interns to recognize when a patient's condition requires specialized treatment. Interns attend sessions with specialists and learn how to evaluate and refer complex cases.

RESOURCES REQUIRED:

- Human Resources: The program involves experienced faculty members, specialists, and supervising clinicians who guide the interns through the process.
- Infrastructure: The dental clinic is designed to provide an environment that replicates private practice, equipped with modern dental tools and patient management systems.



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• Financial Resources: Funds are allocated for maintaining the clinic, as well as for arranging sessions with specialists and updating equipment as needed.

EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:

The Comprehensive Dental Practice Training has shown significant success, with the following indicators:

- Increased Confidence: Interns have expressed greater confidence in their clinical abilities after undergoing this program, feeling more prepared to handle various dental cases independently.
- Improved Clinical Judgment: Interns have developed better decision-making skills, especially in identifying when a case requires a referral to a specialist. This is confirmed by regular feedback from supervising faculty.
- Enhanced Employability: Many graduates from the program have successfully entered private practice, citing the real-world experience they gained as a major benefit during their job search.
